- d. Please explain your comfort level and approach in assisting with homework and engaging in educational activities with children?
- e. Please explain your knowledge level on different stages of child development? Can you provide examples of activities appropriate for different age groups?
- f. Please explain your knowledge level on stimulation of a child's cognitive, social, and emotional development?
- g. Please explain your knowledge level about age-appropriate discipline techniques?
- h. How do you approach technology usage and screen time limits for children in your care?
- i. Are you familiar with age-appropriate online safety practices and guidelines?
- j. Can you provide examples of activities or alternatives to screen time that you would engage children in?

#### 3. Personal Attributes and Qualities:

- a. What qualities do you think are important for an au pair to possess?
- b. How do you handle stressful situations or emergencies?
- c. Please explain and expand on your patience and understanding when it comes to children's behavior?

# 4. Practical Skills:

- a. What specific certifications do you have related to childcare (e.g., CPR, first aid)?
- b. Please explain your comfort level and experience in preparing meals and snacks for children? Do you have any dietary restrictions or preferences?
- c. Please explain your comfort level to assist with light household chores related to the children's care?

#### 5. Interests and Activities:

- a. What are some activities you enjoy doing with children?
- b. Please explain your comfort level in helping children with extracurricular activities (e.g., sports, music, arts)?
- c. Provide more information on any hobbies or special skills you can share with children?

#### 6. Schedule and Availability:

- a. What is your availability for working as an au pair (e.g., part-time, full-time, live-in)?
- b. Are you available to work on weekends or evenings if needed?
- c. What is your preferred duration of an au pair placement (e.g., a few months, a year)?

- d. Are you familiar with emergency contact numbers and procedures in the area where you'll be working?
- e. Are you comfortable being monitored, if applicable, by security cameras installed at our home, and do you have any objections as this relates to looking after our children

#### 9. Driving and Transportation:

- a. Do you have a valid driver's license? If yes, for how long have you been driving?
- b. Please explain your comfort level driving children to school, extracurricular activities, or appointments?
- c. Have you ever been involved in a traffic accident? If yes, please provide details.

# 10. Communication and Conflict Resolution:

- a. How do you communicate with children of different age groups effectively?
- b. Can you provide an example of a time when you had to resolve a conflict between siblings or children in your care?
- c. Please explain your approach in communicating with parents about the children's progress, activities, or any issues that arise?

## 11. Boundaries and Professionalism:

- a. How do you maintain professional boundaries while working as an au pair?
- b. How do you handle situations where the parents' rules or expectations differ from your own?
- c. Please explain your approach and comfort levels following the guidelines and instructions provided by the family?

#### 12. Expectations and Motivations:

- a. What are your expectations for your role as an au pair, both professionally and personally?
- b. How do you plan to balance your personal life with your responsibilities as an au pair?
- c. What are your long-term goals, and how does being an au pair fit into those plans?

# 13. References and Background Checks:

- a. Can you provide contact information for references (e.g., previous employers, teachers, coaches) who can vouch for your character and reliability?
- b. Are you comfortable undergoing a background check, including criminal record verification?
- c. Have you ever been involved in any legal disputes or issues related to childcare?

Remember to maintain a conversational tone during the interviews, allowing the applicants to elaborate on their answers and provide relevant examples. These additional questions should help you gain a comprehensive understanding of the applicant's suitability for an au pair position.
